

- Cooking and Health Education for Families (CHEF), which empowers families to make life-long healthy choices by teaching

- Girls' Leadership Institute, a program that provides young girls with the tools and skills to build healthy relationships, develop
  self-respect, and excel in conflict-management while giving them the confidence to live as leaders.
- Forum for Nonprofits, an annual educational conference that addresses key issues facing small to mid-size nonprofits and the communities they serve. For more than a decade, the Forum for Nonprofits has brought together leading experts to empower volunteers to better serve their community.

The charitable works of the NYJL would not be possible without the support of our generous donors, the collaborative spirit of our more than 50 community partners, and the compassion of our devoted volunteers. Together we are able to build a brighter tomorrow for the women, children, and families of New York City.

Tonight, we celebrate seven women who embody the humanitarian spirit of Mary Harriman. #### NANCY HOUGHTON

"The New York Junior League is a major volunteer and community organization that supports the development and skills of women. The comprehensive leadership training that the Junior League provides to women has resulted in countless opportunities for women to succeed in their areas of interest whether in business or in the volunteer sphere."

"Her entire life—professional and personal—is about giving back to the community." This is how many fellow New York Junior League volunteers, and people of New York City, describe Outstanding Sustainer Nancy Houghton. Continuing the work of many compassionate women before her, including Mary Harriman, Nancy Houghton has made it her personal mission to advocate for the underserved and disadvantaged people of her city.

When Nancy joined the NYJL, her work experience was limited. She credits the training and experiences she received from the Junior League for helping her succeed in her professional career path. "She's taken her volunteerism to a whole other level," notes Bunty Armstrong, NYJL Sustainer, who served on the Thanksgiving Eve Ball Committee with Nancy. "The work is an important part of her life."

The NYJL trained Nancy to value volunteers and she particularly learned from the NYJL that volunteers "must be in a job they like and enjoy doing." Today, and for the past sixteen years, Nancy has been the Executive Director at Health Advocates for Older People, where she uses her training and past experiences with the NYJL to provide 700 free programs each year for more than 1,000 participants. In 2005, Health Advocates developed a volunteer program to provide a wide range of services to seniors including escorting them to appointments, and providing friendly visits, fall prevention initiatives, and nutrition programs that promote healthy aging. Health Advocates harnesses the goodwill and energy of a committed group of volunteers who range in age from nine to ninety to provide a wide range of service to elders.

Nancy's commitment to the work of the NYJL remains strong. In fact, the NYJL Community Health Access Module Program (CHAMP) committee has provided weekly seminars at Health Advocates for Older People for twelve years. Working with this team professionally "has introduced Nancy to a whole new generation of volunteers." She counts the partnership an enormous blessing for the participants of Health Advocates.

Nancy served on the NYJL's Early Childhood
Development committee for over 18 years. She found
that the program was "life changing for parents."
The information learned and taught in Early Childhood
Development highlighted the importance of parental
engagement with their children. The proven research,
which provided reliable data about the ages and stages
of children from birth to three years of age, made an
impact on schools and parents in the wider community.
The lessons Nancy learned during the years she was on
the committee have "spilled over into all areas of her life."
Her volunteer work with Early Childhood Development
inspired her to get a Master's Degree in Psychology with
a focus in parenting from New York University.

In one of her first placements, Nancy worked with the NYJL Breast Cancer committee, which was a pioneer in bringing awareness to women about the then unspoken disease. She served during a time when women such as Betty Ford and Happy Rockefeller were diagnosed, which brought increased media awareness to the committee's work. The committee promoted the importance of monthly self-examinations and Nancy made presentations explaining the life-saving importance of self-examinations to groups of women in the community.

"Nancy does so much work," says Helen Pennoyer, NYJL Sustainer. "And she does it with such charm and grace." Indeed, Nancy served on the NYJL's Placement committee and was a member of the Thanksgiving Eve Ball committee for over twenty years, serving as the Chair in 2001.

In addition to her time with the NYJL, Nancy served on the Board of the Children's Health Service and on the Board of the Knickerbocker Greys, an organization that fosters discipline, leadership development, and responsibility in young boys as they grow up. She has continued her volunteer service at the Church of the Heavenly Rest. Once again, her volunteer experiences have been positively influenced by her training and hands-on work at the New York Junior League. "Volunteering at the Church of the Heavenly Rest has drawn on the skills I learned at the Junior League," Nancy says. "There was an underlying positive attitude at the League about how much can be accomplished to make important projects possible and successful".

Nancy's advocacy and philanthropic spirit serves as a model for future generations of New York women. She encourages new NYJL volunteers to "work hard in your Junior League commitment and be supportive of our mission of community outreach that is constructive for both the city and the people who live here. The important lesson is that when we work together—the upbeat and encouraging vibes of our work and friendship ripple out and bring good will and positive results to others in many different communities."

Nancy is married to Stephen W. Houghton and mother to Stephen and Carlynn.

#### GWENDOLEN L. WADE

"The NYJL was my education in board and committee leadership and formed an invaluable basis for my volunteer work in the New York City community and beyond." Outstanding Sustainer Gwendolen "Wendy" L. Wade credits her long, extraordinary tenure with the NYJL for "preparing her to step out into the New York community at any level and offer volunteer service." The citizens of New York continue to benefit from her long-time advocacy for the health and well-being of her fellow neighbors.

As an active volunteer with the NYJL, Wendy chaired the Provisional Training and Personnel committees. She also served on and chaired the Winter Ball and Thanksgiving Eve Ball committees, important NYJL fundraisers that are "a wonderful way to introduce young women to the League at an early age." As Chair of the Thanksgiving Eve Ball, Wendy had the interesting experience of heading a committee whose members were leaders and former Chairs. This provided Wendy with the "unique experience of balancing long tradition and ways of working with new ideas and necessity of making changes, with the changing times." She is proud of using this experience with the NYJL to strengthen her ability to work with people. "Whether it be in a committee, on a Board, as a facilitator, a workshop leader, or as a teacher, what I learned at the NYJL is a large part of my volunteer roots," she says. "As a Chair of a committee, as a group facilitator, or in any other leadership involvement, it is important to be able to listen to the others involved."

Throughout her many positions, Wendy's service has been steeped with grace and leadership. "Wendy is the type of person who can do it all, and always with a great sense of humor," says Alice Allen, who previously served as Vice President of Communications. "She cares a great deal about people. She gets involved in organizations and projects that benefit others."

Among her numerous roles in the organization, Wendy served on the Board of Directors as Secretary and she also wrote for the NYJL newsletter. She describes her time on the Board as a "wonderful experience, introducing her to the inner workings of the League and to many talented women." Wendy acknowledges serving in this position offered a special opportunity to help plan and shape the future of the Junior League. It is because of this and so much more that in 1980 Wendy was named a NYJL Outstanding Volunteer.

The Thanksgiving Eve Ball, and Wendy's leadership of the committee, still evokes fond memories from many NYJL members. "Wendy is an unbelievable worker—very organized," remembers Bunty Armstrong, NYJL Sustainer. "When she ran the Thanksgiving Ball, it was wonderful. She is delightful and we also had a lot of fun."

Wendy credits the NYJL with giving her the "skills and confidence to explore and experiment with new ideas and the stimulus to follow her passions." She joined the League in her late 20s, just before starting a family. The 1960s and 1970s proved to be a cultural shift for many women as they entered into full-time careers. Wendy acknowledges that volunteering with the NYJL partnered women who did not have full-time careers with those who did and trained both groups toward independence and a sense of professionalism in their volunteer work. Wendy believes that training "forms the basis for a lifetime of focused and intelligent leadership as volunteers."

For Wendy, this sense of pride in work and commitment to her community carried forward in volunteer work outside the League. Anne Perkins, Thanksgiving Eve Ball committee member, explains: "Wendy was and remains committed to helping people and the communities in which they live. I know that she was a very dedicated community services volunteer and that she was heavily involved in a number of projects that she helped bring to fruition. She is still an active and involved member of her community and New York City at large."

In addition to her service with the NYJL, Wendy is the First Vice President of the Health Advocates for Older People, where she was honored beside Edward Cardinal Egan in 2012 as an Outstanding Community Leader. She has held positions on many boards, including NYC Parents in Action, Episcopal Charities, and the Garrison Forest School, where she received the Distinguished Alumna Award in 2016. She is an active member of the St. James' Church, is a former Senior Warden, and has chaired many parishioner committees. It is at St. James' where she continues to volunteer with fellow NYJL members, including Sustainer Susan Relyea. "Wendy and I have had the good fortune of continuing to work as volunteers together in many capacities," says Susan. "Wendy's organization, humor, and perseverance have always been in play. She is a consummate volunteer, a leader, and a dear friend."

Wendy is a healing practitioner, teacher, and a Reiki master. She currently owns Wendy Wade Designs where she creates and manufactures hand-painted and découpaged decorative tôle accessories. Wendy's dedication to giving back was instilled in her by her parents' examples, as they both volunteered actively in their communities.

Wendy is married to George J. Wade and is mother to Barbara Caroline and George Joseph. She is proud that the commitment of service has been passed on to her grandchildren.

Lauren Giordani, Fundraising Events Senior Council Head, expounds on Mary Catherine's success in development: "She has helped to shape our fundraising platform and has been instrumental in driving fundraising revenue to new heights which has allowed the NYJL to expand our impact and reach. She is both a leader and a doer in an artful balance that truly epitomizes our mission of effective action and leadership."

Early in her NYJL career, Mary Catherine served as member and Co-Chair for the Astor House Events committee for three years where she turned often struggling events that were being cancelled for lack of attendance into profit creators with significant ticket sales and low overhead expenses. Natalie Ings, Provisional Training Group Leader, has worked side by side with Mary Catherine on several positions in the NYJL. "Mary Catherine's organization skills and her ability to adequately leverage relationships with partners ensures that events across the NYJL are consistent and efficient for maximum fundraising potential," she says. For this work, Mary Catherine was named an NYJL Woman to Watch in 2013. Later, she was a vital part of the team that created the NYJL's marquee culinary event, Savor the Spring.

Ultimately holding the position of Fundraising Events and Affiliation Senior Council Head, Mary Catherine oversaw the Fundraising Events Councils and sat on the Development Work Group, and identified key strategic partnerships that were incorporated into existing fundraising programming.

Mary Catherine believes that "leadership is action" and credits her success as Senior Council Head with the support she received from "incredible Council Heads as well as committee Chairs that instilled the greatest confidence that they can execute on day-to-day operations." She also believes in the power and benefits of teamwork. "Mary Catherine and I have served together on the Management Council," say Serra Eken, Provisional Training Group Leader. "She played an integral role in making sure our areas and councils collaborated, with our goal of making sure we spotlighted at least one Community committee at each of our events."

Mary Catherine's volunteer experience has been rewarding "because of consistent mentorship from NYJL management." The leadership skills she's developed through her relationships serve as a clear representation of the NYJL values. "Mary Catherine is wise beyond her years. She is so thoughtful in everything she does," explains Mary Cooper, NYJL Sustainer. "She is meticulous with details and she inspires teamwork. I knew the day I met Mary Catherine that we'd become very good friends and that she'd go far in leadership at the NYJL!"

She has recently shifted focus to developing the potential of the future leaders of the NYJL by serving as a member of Provisional Training. "Mary Catherine brings an energy and dynamism to every project she tackles and our organization is better for having her and our volunteers are better off for having worked with her," states Ms. Giordani.

Although the majority of Mary Catherine's volunteer work at the NYJL has been focused on the fiscal health of the organization, she still honors her need to directly touch the lives of her neighbors. Mary Catherine often finds herself working beyond her leadership commitments at the NYJL by helping a community partner located in her East Village neighborhood serve food to those in need.

Professionally, Mary Catherine is a Luxury Account Director for Bloomberg Media, where she also acts as a Best of Bloomberg (BOB) Employee Volunteer at various Bloomberg Philanthropy Projects. She is currently enrolled in the ELLE International Fashion and Luxury Management Program at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) Sloan School of Executive Education.

She credits her time with the NYJL in helping her to become "more sensitive and understanding of the needs of her students and their families." Her work in the New York school systems exposed her to the hard facts that some students may go home to shelters or leave school hungry. The synergetic relationship between her professional and volunteer experience allows Katie to spend her time working towards her personal mission of "assisting those less fortunate and improving the community we live in."

In joining the NYJL, Katie found an organization to help her give back to underserved populations in an effective and organized way. For the last eight years, she has been steadfast in honoring that commitment. She served on the Playground Improvement Project (PIP) as a committee member and Vice-Chair, before becoming the Co-Chair in 2013. Among the many projects Katie participated in during her time on the committee, she was most proud to collaborate with the parks manager to revitalize Tompkins Square Park, an East Side landmark. She and her team partnered with another NYJL community committee, Project Muse, to create a student-designed mural to help beautify the play area, and repaint the park as part of the much needed improvements. Katie credits working countless afternoons in the park for allowing fellow volunteers and her to spend time with the people of the community. She has fond memories of meeting and talking with neighbors as they enjoyed the new features of their parks. It was especially rewarding when community members also participated in the project and made an effort to "thank her and the team for all they were doing to improve their beloved space."

Katie found long days of gardening, painting, and other tasks challenging at times, but when she stepped back and looked at all the work the team had done over the course of several weekends, it gave her a true sense of accomplishment. These accomplishments have been seen by many in the organization. "I knew Katie was a true leader the first time I met her. I was volunteering at PIP while she was a Co-Chair," states Joan Pedley, NYJL Sustainer. "She is the first to step in for any big job, leading large committees such as PIP, CIP, and CHEF. She organizes her volunteers and ensures they see the big picture and understand the impact they have on the lives of the community we serve."

The Playground Improvement Project "will always have a special place in her heart." It is the first committee Katie joined and the one she has spent the longest amount of time on during her tenure at the NYJL. Beth Batiuchok, Building Blocks Co-Chair, has worked with Katie in various capacities. She shares, "Katie works from the heart. As a result, each committee, council, and endeavor she undertakes is executed with excellence. I feel privileged to have worked alongside her and honored to count her as a friend."

Katie also has held the crucial role of Co-Chair of the Community Improvement Project (CIP). During her time on the committee, they partnered with the Union Settlement Association and renovated the multipurpose room to make it a sanctuary for the youth of East Harlem.

As a chef, Katie's expertise was perfectly suited for her position as Co-Chair of the Cooking and Health Education for Families (CHEF) committee. She was able to take her professional experience working in NYC public schools to help develop new lessons, recipes, and supply kits for the educational workshops. She stepped into the role having never served on the committee and was able to help it quickly expand and grow to a super committee. Explains Nicole Pappas Ferrin, Community Senior Council Head and fellow Outstanding Volunteer: "Katie has been a rockstar to work with these past few years. Her professional background and knowledge surrounding food, combined with her affable and enthusiastic personality, have made her invaluable to CHEF and as a council head, as well as being someone fun to work with!"

Katie is currently serving the second year of her term as the Child Health & Welfare Council Head. She oversees seven community committees including CHEF. She "still feels connected to the committee" and is actively working to ensure volunteers and clients are getting the most out of their time. Jana Beauchamp, who serves as Director at Large, Board of Directors, has witnessed much of Katie's leadership: "Katie is one of the most impressive people I have worked with in my NYJL career. She is an NYJL all-star—it is no wonder she is Council Head and has chaired all of the three largest community committees: PIP, CIP and CHEF!"

Outside of the NYJL, Katie continues to work as a chef in the public school system, training school cafeteria staff on the implementation of a scratch-based lunch menu. She also provides cooking classes and nutrition education to students.

A meaningful future with the NYJL seemed inevitable for a younger Nicole who was a member of the high school organization called Twenty Little Working Girls that promotes volunteerism and empowers young girls to learn leadership skills. Over the years, much of Nicole's work with the NYJL has reminded her of the community-based projects her family completed while she was growing up, including a trip to the Galapagos Islands where she and her family spent a day working with a local school to revitalize their playground.

For over a decade, Nicole has directly touched the communities the NYJL serves. She was a member, Vice-Chair, and Co-Chair of the Performance of a Lifetime committee where she worked with the children of the Boys & Girls Harbor, introducing them to live performances at community venues. She bonded with students over the course of many years and "got to know them and watch them grow as little people." Nicole also works with youth in her professional career as the Director of Admissions and Administration at Barrow Street Nursery School. Among her many responsibilities, she leads a parent and teacher group that plans projects and activities to show very young children the value of helping others who are less fortunate in the community. "Nicole's professional background in education coupled with her passion for the community we serve has made her a truly tremendous asset to the NYJL," explains Jana Beauchamp, Director at Large, Board of Directors. "Nicole is a NYJL wonder woman—a strong leader; someone who you can always count on to be there and step up when needed, do the right thing 100% of the time, be the ultimate team player across the entire NYJL,

and always sing the praises of others and let her team shine. It is no wonder she is an Outstanding Volunteer."

Nicole's work led her to accept the two-year term of the Culture & the Arts Council Head in 2014. Coming full circle, in this position she oversaw the NYJL's 25th Playground Improvement Project.

In addition to her commitments in working in the community, Nicole remains active in helping plan the future of the NYJL as part of the Strategic Planning Work Group. This experience has allowed her to gain a larger perspective and unique insight into the organization and the nonprofit structure, along with the issues nonprofit and volunteer-based organizations currently face. She is able to apply the knowledge learned from the NYJL to both her volunteer work with other organizations and her professional work at Barrow Street Nursery School.

Last year Nicole served on the 115th Anniversary Planning Task Force, planning and coordinating 115 hours of continuous volunteering for "Around the Community, Around the Clock." Nicole knows "there is literally no limit to what the volunteers of the NYJL can accomplish and we should never stop trying." She proved this point by coordinating participants, which included over 400 NYJL volunteers of all ages, community members, students and more to provide 1,500 hours of service. During the initiative, volunteers worked tirelessly throughout a 115-hour period, renovating invaluable park spaces in New York, serving over 350 meals, conducting workshops, teaching art lessons, preparing and monitoring homeless shelters overnight, and decorating over 250 holiday bags for God's Love,

We Deliver. "This event wouldn't have happened without Nicole. The 115th Anniversary and the "Around the Community, Around the Clock" initiative illustrated what the NYJL is capable of and what Nicole is about—giving back to the community," says Anne Bahr Thompson, Director at Large, Board of Directors. "She does everything so gracefully that you don't know how much she is doing. Then you look back and see all the amazing work she's done."

Nicole currently holds the position of Community Senior Council Head. "Nicole puts her head down and gets the work done. She cares about the success of the volunteers she works with and the community they serve," states Kara Van Norden, Membership Senior Council Head. "She finds a way to communicate what she needs—with compassion for her colleagues and their needs."

For the last five years, Nicole has been a member of the Room to Grow Young Professional Group, a NYJL partner she learned about when taking part in the Nonprofit Boards Clearinghouse course at the NYJL.

Working as a family to help underserved communities continues to be a priority for Nicole. As Courtney Wessling, LIFT Co-Chair, observes, "It amazes me how much time and dedication Nicole has given to the Junior League over the last several years. Her parents have always instilled volunteerism into her core values and the NYJL is incredibly lucky to have her." Nicole has two young daughters, Eleanor and Cecily, and believes it is important for them to see and learn from parents who give back to the community. She "cannot think of another organization that she could be more proud of to share with them."

Chicago, New York City, Boston, Los Angeles, San Francisco. This list of cities may seem like vacation destinations to most people, but for Elizabeth "Liz" Fabsits Pavone these are all cities where she's donated her time with the Junior League.

Transferring from Chicago in 2004, the NYJL offered Liz "the opportunity to get plugged into a community of like-minded women and learn about her new city." She soon found a "home away from home at the New York Junior League, where every time she walks through the doors of the Astor House, she sees a smiling face of a fellow volunteer and feels inspired to continue to give back to her community."

Liz has also served on the Nominating committee where she "learned the organizational structure of the NYJL and the importance that everyone plays in accomplishing the organization's goals." She continued her service by co-chairing the Community Improvement Project (CIP) in 2015–2016, where they partnered with the Hartley House in Hell's Kitchen for the renovation of their Creative Learning Space for youth. She led over 30 NYJL volunteers, who collectively gave 650 hours of service to complete the renovation project. After the project was completed, the Hartley House soon honored the NYJL with the Philanthropic Excellence Award.

Liz and Rosemarie worked together on the Nominating committee as well as on the Forum for Nonprofits committee. Professionally, Kim has had a long career as a communications professional at leading global organizations and currently works as an internal communications executive.



## COMMUNITY IMPACT




NYJL volunteers work in association with more than 15 New York City nonprofit organizations to provide immediate assistance and community impact through it's Done in a Day (DIAD) and Done in a Day On Demand (DIAD-OD) programs. Volunteers lend a helping hand and complete short-term projects to address needs in the community.

The New York Junior League (NYJL), a nonprofit organization of trained women volunteers, has been helping build a brighter tomorrow for children and families in New York City since 1901. Each year, more than 2,800 volunteers collectively donate more than 250,000 hours of service. Working together with more than 50 community partners, the NYJL embodies a positive force for change within the communities it serves. The NYJL seeks to strengthen the health and well-being of the children and families of New York through five distinct program areas: Adult Education & Mentoring, Child Health & Welfare, Children's Education, City Impact, and Culture & the Arts.



### ADULT EDUCATION & MENTORING





Volunteers with the Senior Friends program build relationships with the residents of Jewish Home Lifecare and organize engaging activities to enrich the lives of the residents and help foster a greater sense of community.

Adult Education & Mentoring programs focus on providing adults with life skills training to become healthy, productive citizens of New York City. NYJL volunteers advocate for adults in need and provide training and counseling for a wide variety of areas. From supporting survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault in New York City hospitals in partnership with New York-Presbyterian Hospital's Domestic & Other Violence Emergencies (DOVE) program to teaching financial literacy to adults at the English-Speaking Union to providing guidance to homeless teens at Covenant House, NYJL volunteers strive to help people live their best lives.



### CHILD HEALTH & WELFARE





The Cooking and Health Education for Families (CHEF) program empowers families to make life-long healthy choices by teaching proper nutrition and physical activity. CHEF's comprehensive workshops teach families how to make and prepare healthy on-the-go snacks, breakfasts, lunches, dinners, and desserts.

Mentors can establish a life-long support system that leads to continued success for at-risk youth. Through Child Health & Welfare programs, volunteers work to teach young people that challenging life circumstances provide opportunities to learn, grow, and persevere. Working in conjunction with community partners like SCAN New York, Mentoring USA, and Good Shepherd Services, NYJL volunteers use their expertise and relationship-building skills to ensure that youth can overcome difficult life circumstances and obstacles. The NYJL uses a positive approach and harnesses individual strengths to foster responsibility, self-esteem, and initiative.



### CHILDREN'S EDUCATION





The Personal Empowerment Project (PEP) focuses on providing career mentoring for girls and helps open students' minds to different career paths. Students are paired with an NYJL volunteer who helps them explore a variety of professions.

Working together with community partners, Children's Education programs strive to empower parents, guardians, and caregivers with the tools to help them build a positive future for themselves and their families. For families who are homeless, headed by a single parent, or experiencing other difficulties, the stress of daily life can be overwhelming. NYJL volunteers help alleviate some of the pressures families face by providing education support in a variety of disciplines including math, science, art, financial literacy, reading, and writing.

## CITY IMPACT



The Playground Improvement Project (PIP) partners with the New York City Department of Parks and Recreation to revitalize a New York City park in need of repair. For more over 25 years, NYJL volunteers have designed, planned, funded, and completed a playground renovation each spring.

City Impact programs encourage NYJL volunteers to undertake service projects to better the city they love. From restoring New York City parks through the Playground Improvement Project to lending a helping hand to other Manhattan-based organization through the Done in a Day and Done in a Day on Demand programs, NYJL volunteers take pride in making a positive impact on their community. Each year the Community Improvement Project establishes a one-year partnership with a selected nonprofit organization to assist in increasing the facility's community impact through a capital donation of more than \$50,000.



### CULTURE & THE ARTS





NYJL volunteers lead students in activities geared toward exploring many forms of art, including drama, dance, painting, sculpture, poetry, music, photography and more through a variety of Culture & the Arts programs.

Culture & the Arts programs bring arts education and appreciation to underserved New York City children and teenagers to encourage self-expression while building confidence and self-esteem. Working in tandem with community partners like the Stanley M. Isaacs Neighborhood Center, P.S. 64, Boys & Girls Harbor, and Grosvenor Neighborhood House YMCA, NYJL volunteers provide exposure to art and music through robust visual and performing arts curricula and supplemental trips to venues from The Met to Carnegie Hall and beyond.



The CHAMP Committee of the NYJL has presented over 480 health related seminars to the 1100 senior participants of Health Advocates for Older People since 2005.


